Salvation ruled, healing reigned and the rain was held back by the hand of God!


Aleta Wendo is a small town located in the Southern Region of Ethiopia. It has an estimated population of 50,000 inhabitants and sits among fertile forests. All this greenery necessitates a good annual rainfall and our crusade was being held in the final month of the dry season. The weather forecast for the week of our crusade did not bode well. Rain was predicted to fall on a daily basis, from early in the afternoon to late in the evening. Yet, the Lord heard the prayers of our dear friends and partners around the world—together with the fervent intercession of the local believers—and sufficiently calmed the stormy weather so that it did not interfere with any of our services. We experienced a little drizzle during out first meeting but nothing that disturbed the attentiveness of the crowd. We thank the Lord! The Gospel was proclaimed with power and simplicity in service after service and attendance grew rapidly. The energy and enthusiasm of the people was electric. Soon, tens of thousands were flocking to the stadium and during the crusade period, over 40,000 pieces of follow-up material were distributed. In such a small town, this is absolutely fantastic!

He had been suffering terribly from high blood pressure and diabetes for the past five years. His sight had also deteriorated to the point that he could barely see. Now, all symptoms have disappeared and his eyesight is flawless. Heiles fell on his knees on stage, glorifying God. "I can even read again!" he exclaimed, indicating the follow-up material that had been given to him by an usher during the service. "I pray that everyone else is healed as well!" Tamiry is 50 years old. Five years ago, he lost his hearing in both ears and his chest began to ail him terribly, making it very difficult to breathe. During prayer, his ears popped open and his chest opened up, resulting in one excessively happy fellow! Azeleeh is an elderly woman who had been afflicted by heart and kidney problems since she was a child. "I have suffered for a lifetime," she explained. Now, the symptoms of those ailments have disappeared together with all pain. Birae is 40 years old. The vision in her right eye was exceedingly blurry. "If one person stood before me, I would see four people," she expounded. The Lord healed her eye completely, leaving Birae overwhelmed with joy. Belamo (50 years of age) had been plagued by arthritis in every joint. He could not bend his knees. He could not hold anything in his hands, his fingers not being able to flex or clench. Jesus healed him from top to toe. Liberated, Belamo jumped up and down and praised the Lord. Hallelujah!







Limpopo project update

Restrictions on gatherings in South Africa remain rigid. At the time of the release of this newsletter, outdoor gatherings cannot exceed 250 attendees. Consequently, our team in Limpopo, South Africa have continued targeting the locations where people queue for services of products—from post offices to liquor stores—in Giyani, Malamulele, Vuwani, Saselamani, N'wamankena and Thohoyandou. While schools in the province are not yet holding assemblies due to the pandemic—at which our team are eager to start preaching—they have grasped other opportunities to impact both the children and their parents. They minister to kids as they journey home from school and give them salvation literature in the Tsonga language to take home to their families. They have also been invited to preach at certain special events at which children and parents are present, one example being a ceremony at which sponsored backpacks were distributed. Their efforts have resulted in a wonderful total of 2,037 souls won for Christ over the past month and followed up by the local pastors with whom they are working. We thank the Lord!
