GOSPEL CRUSADES



27-30 October 2022



Meki is a bustling farming hub that lies around 140km south of Addis Ababa, surrounded by villages. Clashes in the area between government forces and rebel groups made the local authorities nervous and we needed to abide by a strict 6pm curfew. Yet, despite the civil instability, tens of thousands gathered on our grassy crusade field over four days and six services, eager to hear the Good News that Jesus saves! After every meeting, we bore witness to groups of young people, dancing their way home down the streets of Meki, singing praises to Jesus. We can declare without doubt that this precious, Ethiopian town has been forever changed! Over 30,000 pieces of follow-up material were distributed during our time there and the local pastors diligently connected with every new convert.





Prayer for the sick was packed with power. Zarihun is a 42-year-old husband, father of three and merchant. Two years ago, he was in an accident and broke his left leg. That leg never healed properly. He was unable to walk on it and it caused him immense pain. During prayer, Jesus made the limb perfectly sound! Zarihun ran up and down on stage several times, jumping and leaping with exuberance. Asaiba is a young lady of 13. Several months ago, a tumour started developing in her throat. She could feel it in her neck and swallowing became increasingly difficult. Wonderfully, Jesus intervened and that tumour has completely disappeared! Ecstatic, Asaiba praised the Lord. Nagao is an 18-year-old student who had been unable to hear out of her right ear for the past six years. During our crusade, that ear popped open and her hearing was restored. "My life has completely changed!" she voiced.



On the Sunday morning, all evangelical churches in Meki closed their doors and everyone gathered on the crusade field for one glorious mass service. We distributed Certificates of Appreciation to the pastors and volunteers, as well as 100 copies of the Amharic translation of Tamryn's book, "Spirit of Fire". We also handed out twenty solar powered Amharic audio Bibles, generously donated by MegaVoice Southern Africa. Tamryn taught on the Holy Spirit throughout the crusade period, making it clear that He wants to fill every believer with Himself and use them with power to preach the Gospel and set the captives free. During our final service on Sunday afternoon, we prayed for each child of God to be saturated with the Spirit of the Almighty. What magnificent, divine chaos broke out! Men and women, young and old were filled from on High, speaking in other tongues and glorifying God. An army of soul-winners was born, ready to take Ethiopia for Jesus.



BENSADAYE

8-11 December 2022



Bensa Daye is located over 400km south of the Ethiopian capital city of Addis Ababa. The Sidama people inhabit the location, whose lives centre around agriculture, including the farming of coffee and false banana. The build-up to our crusade was fantastic in its own right. We trained local believers for soul-winning and engaged in both one-on-one witnessing and mini-outreaches with them. The churches in Bensa Daye were not in the habit of doing street evangelism before this but our time with them has created an evangelistic culture in these congregations. During the crusade period itself, which ran over four days and included six services, tens of thousands called upon the name of the Lord and more than 25,000 pieces of follow-up material were distributed. May each fledgling believer become a mighty man or woman of God in their community!



Prayer for the sick was followed by tremendous testimonies. Among them was 20-year-old Habtamu who had fallen from a tree over a month ago. His right arm had been badly injured and his right hand, broken. Limited access to medical care made giving that arm and hand the needed attention, impossible. The arm remained in agony and the hand, immobile. During prayer, Jesus touched this young man in a powerful way. His hand is now perfect and his arm, strong. Roda is a 47-year-old farmer and father of five. He had been mad for fifteen, long years ago, his mind utterly tormented and confused. He was unable to think lucidly and his family suffered terribly because of his mental distress. During our crusade, he received Jesus as Saviour and with his salvation, came his deliverance. "You all know me," Roda shared from stage. "You know how mad I was. Now, my mind is clear!" Buja is a 60-year-old grandmother. A year ago, a tumour started to develop in her lower abdomen. It had grown so large that she could easily feel the mass and her doctor had told her that she would need to be operated on very soon. During one of our services, Dr Jesus performed His own procedure and Buja could not contain her excitement as she testified. "I do not need an operation any longer!" she announced. "The tumour is gone!"





The Sunday of our crusade week was fire-filled and Spirit-saturated from beginning to end. We began the day with a mass church service on our crusade field, the evangelical congregations all closing their doors and uniting as the Body of Christ, regardless of denomination. We handed out certificates to lead pastors and volunteers, thanking them for their support, together with 100 copies of the Amharic version of Tamryn's book, "Spirit of Fire" which teaches on evangelism. Come evening and our final service, Tamryn preached one last message on the Holy Spirit after the Gospel had been shared, before we prayed for Jesus to baptise His children with His Spirit. What holy chaos erupted! Believers were filled to overflowing with the presence and power of God. May they go forth into the highways and byways as His witnesses, with signs and wonders following. We prayed for all the prayer requests that had been submitted over the crusade period and also, the nation of Ethiopia.

19-22 February 2023



Heideveld is a suburb of Cape Town, South Africa that is plagued by gangsterism and drug abuse. In fact, the violence in this community and its surrounding areas has resulted in Cape Town constantly finding itself classed among the most dangerous cities in the word, according to murder rate. Currently, it sits in tenth position. What an ideal location for a Gospel Crusade! Our crusade in Heideveld was a little different to those that In His Name usually holds. Normally, our team labours with the local pastors and believers, funding everything and overseeing all planning. This time, we embarked on a collaborative effort with not only the local pastors of Heideveld, Bonteheuwel and Manenberg but also, several other organisations: Christ for all Nations, YWAM Muizemberg, CCFM and Kevin Kazemi Ministries. The Gospel was preached in the schools, on the streets and over the air waves, each non-profit doing its part to make this soul-winning initiative a spectacular success. A total of 5,727 decisions for Jesus were recorded and eagerly followed up by the local pastors. We thank the Lord!



The crusade itself was held over four evenings. Each night, two sermons were preached. The first message was a salvation message, which clearly communicated our need for Jesus and ended with an invitation to receive Him as Saviour. The focus of the second was the equipping of the saints, with a special emphasis on the Holy Spirit and how to cooperate with Him to win the lost and pray for the sick. During the final service, we prayed for the Holy Spirit baptism and the results were glorious. Thousands of believers were set ablaze to preach Jesus with signs and wonders following. During every service, we prayed for those in need of healing or deliverance and spectacular miracle testimonies were shared.





Soraya, an elegant, middle-aged lady, came with a hole in her one eardrum the size of a ten cents coin. The Lord healed that eardrum completely, performing a creative miracle. "I am so happy!" Soraya exclaimed, rejoicing in her newfound hearing. Tony is a 62-year-old pensioner. He was in an accident in December last year, which resulted in him hurting his back. This injury caused a terrible numbness in his feet and toes. During prayer, he felt a warmth going through his body and then, feeling started returning to his feet. "If I take my shoes off right now," he expressed, "I know that I will be able to wriggle my toes. I can feel them again!" Elated, Tony bounced up and down on stage. Derek, a 55-year-old believer, had battled severe arthritis in his fingers and shoulders for the past three years. He wept on stage, overcome with emotion as he opened and closed his hands, explaining how the debilitating pains were no more. Peter is 69 years old and received Jesus as Saviour during the crusade. Our Lord did not stop there, transforming his body, after winning his heart. "For the past 5 years, I have experienced constant ringing in my ears. It was terribly frustrating. Now, the ringing is no more. I am so excited!"

SHAKISO

2-5 March 2023



Shakiso is located around 500km south of Addis Ababa in an area of Ethiopia known for its mining of gold and tantalum. It is populated primarily by the Oromo people. With three quarters of its population adhering to other religions, we went to sweep this town into the arms of Jesus and also, equip the church for soul-winning. Even before the crusade began, 867 decisions for Jesus were recorded on the streets. Our crusade itself was held on a school field, located in the midst of town activity. In the week before our crusade began, tribal unrest sparked in the area. Such settled enough for our crusade to continue unaffected, except for a 6pm curfew by which we needed to abide. Thankfully, the people were quite happy to come early and return home before it got dark. Tens of thousands attended, enveloping the stage on all sides. Services were held in both the morning and afternoon, so great was the hunger of the people. The Good News was proclaimed again and again with crystal clarity. In fact, over 40,000 pieces of follow-up material were distributed during the crusade period, the response to every salvation message preached being absolutely terrific.



Prayer for the sick yielded spectacular miracles. One dear lady, 45-year-old Amele, shook with joy, so great was the level of her elation. At the age of 23, she survived a war that wrecked her community. The conflict, however, left her completely deaf in both ears. Her life was never the same. She never married. She was unable to work. During our crusade, one simple prayer changed everything for her. "In the name of Jesus, deaf ears open!" was the declaration from stage. Suddenly, Amele could hear—and perfectly. She shared her story and the crowd responded with shouts of praise. Gete was also ecstatic. A 60-year-old widow, she had lost her one eye as a child. The sight in the other eye was now exceedingly poor and she struggled to see. Putting her hand over her eye during prayer, she removed it after the final, "Amen!" had been said and gasped with delight—she could see! Kidsti is 35 years old and a mother of three children. Ten years ago, a tumour started to grow beneath her one breast. It was now large and uncomfortable. After prayer, when we asked people to check their bodies to see if the Lord had worked a miracle, Kidsti felt for that tumour. It was gone! Overjoyed, she testified with tremendous zeal. "I thank my Lord," she expressed. "I am free!"





On the Sunday morning, all the evangelical churches in Shakiso gathered together for a mass service. We handed out Certificates of Appreciation on stage to the key leaders. They will hold their own special ceremony to hand out certificates to the other leaders and many volunteers. We also left 120 copies of the Amharic version of Tamryn's book, "Spirit of Fire" with them, which teaches on the Holy Spirit and evangelism. Come afternoon, Tamryn gave one final teaching on the Holy Spirit baptism—having taught on this marvellous subject in previous services—and explaining how after one is filled with Him, how one should work with Him to share the Gospel and pray for the sick. The pastors gathered on stage and together, we prayed for the baptism of the Holy Spirit. What a glorious floodtide ensued of His power and presence! Believers were saturated with Him and overwhelmed by Him. We know that they will go forth boldly, preaching Jesus with signs and wonders following. We also prayed for all the prayer requests that had been submitted during the crusade period and look forward to hearing many mighty testimonies from the pastors of breakthrough after breakthrough.



BONGA 6-9 April 2023



Bonga is thought to be the oldest town in south-west Ethiopia. It is situated in the Kaffa region, where coffee was first discovered. The persecution that the evangelicals face in Bonga is intense. Our team was not allowed to openly preach the Gospel in the streets, as we usually do in the run-up to our crusades. In fact, some months ago, missionaries were arrested for doing this. Thankfully, we were granted permission by the local authorities to hold our mass meetings—the first of their kind in Bonga—and so, we soldiered forward with great faith and fortitude. When we started our crusade preparations in Bonga, only around 10% of its inhabitants were born again. Now, that percentage is much greater! Over 15,000 pieces of follow-up material were distributed during our four days of services. "We cannot begin to express the impact you have made," articulated the evangelical fraternal chairman. "You have broken new ground. We have never had anything like this."



Prayer for the sick was followed by wonderful testimonies. Testaye is a 57-year-old farmer and father of eight. For the past ten years, his body has been a hothouse of aches and infirmities. "My entire body was in pain," he explained. "Everything was difficult for me to do." He attended our crusade from the first service, believing the Lord fervently for his healing. On his way home after one of the meetings, Testaye had an open vision of someone standing before him and handing him a gift. In his vision, he accepted it and instinctively knew that it was his healing. Continuing home, he went to bed. The next morning, when Testaye awoke, all soreness and symptoms were gone! He testified with tremendous glee, jumping up and down and showing off his newfound, sorrow-free state. Asnakechi is a 45-year-old mother of four and a homemaker. Five months ago, she suffered a stroke. Since then, she struggled with mobility in her right side and also, tremors. The Lord restored her mobility and banished the shaking, leaving an elated and rejoicing Asnakechi. "He healed me for free!" she expressed, moving her body about on stage. "I did not even have to give Him money. Jesus is my only Lord and my only Saviour!"





On Sunday morning, all evangelical churches closed their doors and their pastors and congregation members met on our crusade field for a mass service. We praised the risen Lord and handed out Certificates of Appreciation to the pastors and volunteers, as well as copies of the Amharic version of Tamryn's book on the Holy Spirit and evangelism, "Spirit of Fire". In addition to preaching the Gospel and praying for the sick, teachings on the Holy Spirit and evangelism were also presented, layer upon layer being laid, culminating in prayer for the baptism of the Holy Spirit during the final service. The objective was to equip every believer to be used by God, ensuring that by the completion of the crusade, an army of avid soul-winners had been birthed who would continue ministering the Good News in Bonga. Objective achieved! Prayer for the Holy Spirit baptism was power-packed. Believers were filled from on high with the Spirit of the Most High and committed enthusiastically to sharing Jesus with friends, family, co-workers and strangers. This crusade was only the beginning of what our Lord is eager to do in Bonga!



FIRE CONFERENCES



DIRE DAWA & HARAR

1-4 Sep 22 • 8-11 Sep 22



We started building our relationships with the evangelical fellowships of Dire Dawa and Harar in August 2021, when we included these cities among those we visited to distribute the Amharic version of "Spirit of Fire"—the book that Tamryn wrote on the Holy Spirit and evangelism. Both locations are in desperate need of the Gospel. They are found in the far east of Ethiopia, around 50km apart, close to the borders of Djibouti and Somalia. Dire Dawa is a thriving city with half a million inhabitants but less than 3% of these being born again. Harar is deemed to be the fourth holiest city of Islam, after Mecca, Medina and Jerusalem. In fact, it quite possibly has the largest concentration of mosques in the world, with over eighty in total within a relatively small area—three of which date from the 10th century—and additionally, over one hundred shrines. Less than 6% of its population are born again.



We held a four-day Fire Conference in Dire Dawa from 1-4 September and another in Harar, from 8-11 September. Our venues were the largest, most centralised churches in these cities. The purpose of Fire Conferences is straightforward: Empower local believers to share the Gospel in their own communities, with signs and wonders following! We poured into the delegates in session after session, teaching them key principles relating to the Holy Spirit and evangelism. We equipped them to be used by God with power and the messages were received with fervour, every truth being wholeheartedly absorbed. During the final service in both cities, we spent extensive time laying hands on every attendee, praying for them with intensity. Men and women were filled with the Spirit, bondages were broken, boldness imparted, diseases vanquished and believers fired up for soul-winning. It was a time of splendid, divine chaos.





The fruit that these Fire Conferences will bear is going to be terrific. Harar and Dire Dawa are not easy places to live as born-again believers. However, our God is busy cracking open the spiritual darkness that pervades these cities—and the greater area in which they are found—and causing the Light of Life to shine supreme. Dearest friend, thank you such much for your faithful prayer and financial support. You have mightily impacted two cities with minority born-again populations, setting the believers ablaze with the fire of God and rallying them for extravagant evangelistic efforts. Dire Dawa and Harar shall be saved and you have played an essential role in bringing this to pass. Ethiopia belongs to Jesus!






BAHIR DAR & GONDAR

25-28 May 23 • 1-4 June 23



While mass crusades are our passion and calling, we also love ministering in places where these are not possible—and public venues not even hirable by evangelical churches—due to religious persecution. In such locations, we hold Fire Conferences in the largest and most central church compounds to equip and empower local believers for intense, one-on-one evangelistic efforts. Two such places are Bahir Dar and Gondar. Both are located in the northern, Amhara region of Ethiopia. The city of Bahir Dar—with a population of half a million people—sits on the edge of Lake Tana, the largest lake in Ethiopia and the source of the Blue Nile. Less than 2% of its inhabitants are born again and it is home to only twenty or so evangelical churches. Gondar is a historic city, one of the oldest in Ethiopia and which served as the capital of the country for over 200 years. Like Bahir Dar, less that 2% of its population are born again and even though the city is home to hundreds of thousands of inhabitants, it has only thirteen evangelical churches.





In both locations—Bahir Dar from 25-28 May and Gondar from 1-4 June—two full days of power-packed teachings on the Holy Spirit and evangelism were presented on the Thursday and Friday, hands being laid on all delegates in the final service. All who attended were fired up for Jesus and then sent back to their respective churches to pass on the knowledge gained and lead the soul-winning charge. Each delegate received the Amharic version of Tamryn's book, "Spirit of Fire" and also, one of our wristbands which breaks the Gospel down into six simple steps, helping the wearer to explain the salvation message and also, helping the person to whom that message is being shared to better understand it. Over the weekend, multiple services were held on the Saturday and Sunday that were evangelistic in nature and open for all to attend, believers bringing their unsaved friends and family. The response to the Gospel in these services was terrific. In such cities, if one converts from another religion, the consequence includes exile from family and community. It is no small decision to call upon the name of the Lord.



We also prayed for the sick and this was followed by terrific testimonies. Almaze is 30 years old. Six years ago, a tumour started developing behind her right knee. It became very large, making walking uncomfortable. Gloriously, during prayer, that tumour vanished. Elated, Almaze kept touching the back of her knee, in awe of the goodness of God. "It is gone! The tumour is gone!" she expressed, bubbling with joy. Sifalig is a 30-year-old mother of four children. Five years ago, her mind became foggy. She could not think clearly and struggled to fulfil basic, day-to-day tasks. Desperate, she went to visit a hospital in Addis that specialises in mental conditions, but they could not help her. During one of our services, the mental fog dissipated—and has not returned! "I can think clearly again!" Sifalig expressed, her children clinging to her as she testified. Helen is 19 years old. Six months ago, she felt tumours in both breasts that continued to grow larger and larger. She not only received Jesus as Saviour but the tumours disappeared completely—she cannot feel them at all. We thank the Lord!






EVANGELIST TRAINIG
